- Lactation education and support services to your breastfeeding clients/employees.



Protecting, promoting and supporting breastfeeding is an important part of public health. The Rockland County Department of Health (RCDOH) Breastfeeding Promotion and Support Program invites you to join a national effort to support breastfeeding moms and babies.

Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Centers provide active support to breastfeeding families, and help mothers to continue breastfeeding when they return to work or school.

If you would like your center to be designated as "Breastfeeding Friendly," complete the information below and the self-assessment form. The form lists six standards with best practices under each standard. The best practices are listed to help your center meet these standards. Centers that answer **YES** to all six standards <u>and</u> include a copy of the center's breastfeeding policy will be awarded a certificate which designates them as "Breastfeeding Friendly" on the RCDOH website <u>www.rocklandgov.com/departments/health/</u>. The certificate expires three years form the issue date, and you will need to complete a renewal form at that time.

If you are interested in becoming "Breastfeeding Friendly" and want to learn more, the RCDOH can provide assistance with creating your "Breastfeeding-Friendly" policy and free breastfeeding training for your staff.
